» INTRODUCTION of RN to BSN PROGRAM

World Mission University has developed a Bachelor of Science in Nursing, which was launched in Fall of 2019 by the RN to BSN Completion Program.

The program will encourage the self-development of modern-age nurses, by cultivating students' abilities to actively cope out changes in industry, to be the change they want to see as leaders among their peers, and to produce professional personnel with scientific knowledge and nursing practice skills. The purpose of the nursing program is to become nursing professionals who can lead the improvement of the quality of our Korean nursing community by cultivating leadership ability and practicing human love based on Christian values.

The RN to BSN program is designed as an academic progression model for students who have an Associates degree in Nursing and are practicing as registered nurses to advance their education to the Bachelor of Science level. It requires a completion of 36 credits of nursing courses, 1 credit of chapel, and 15 credits of biblical courses. Students will complete the entire program over Zoom and other online resources that provide synchronized distance learning. This program is geared primarily for working registered nurses who are seeking professional improvement and advancement. Most of our students will be adult learners studying on a part-time basis and will normally complete the program over a period of 18 months (3 semesters).

» REQUIREMENT of RN to BSN PROGRAM

The program requires 37 credits(including Chapel 1 credit).

» RN to BSN ADMISSION CRITERIA

This program is open to applicants who have earned the followings;

- 1) Associate of Science in Nursing Degree
- 2) RN license in U.S.

All applicants for the proposed RN to BSN program will be required a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA, completion of Associate Degree in Nursing from an accredited nursing program, and an unencumbered RN license.

» RN to BSN CURRICULUM

The curriculum is based on Essentials of Baccalaureate of Education identified by American Association of Colleges of Nursing, and the academic progression model of the National League of Nursing with application of Competencies for Graduates of Baccalaureate programs.

The University offers a range of student services, including admissions, registration, financial aid, academic advising, technological support, and personal and spiritual counseling. Since the program will be conducted over synchronized zoom sessions through online, nursing students will have online access to all these resources regardless of wherever students live. The curriculum that follows will be offered over 3 semesters or 18 months.

The Bible and General Education requirement may result in a longer degree program for students who do not transfer in those credits. Those who do not have enough credits will be allowed to complete the requirements during their program at the university.

** These two courses are offered in 8 week online sessions.*

» RN to BSN PROGRAM STRATEGIES

In order to achieve this purpose, the program pursues these strategies :

1. To provide high quality, student-centered learning environments such as 1 on 1 student: faculty mentor support system
2. To incorporate evidence-based care and the use of clinical reasoning.
3. To support spiritual, intellectual, and professional development of students.
4. To foster collaboration with healthcare stakeholders in the local and global communities.



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
